## Christmas tree collection - One day!

Discard your cut Christmas tree following the holidays. The Borough will collect trees placed curbside on only one designated day - Friday, January 9, 2026. Be sure to have your tree out no later than 7 a.m. and that it is free of ornaments, bag, and stand. In the event of inclement weather, collection could be rescheduled to Friday, Jan. 16.

If you miss the designated collection day, it will be your responsibility to take the tree to the Borough's compost area at the end of North Delaware Ave. any day that the site is open. Trees must be recycled and will not be taken with regular garbage collection.

# Tips from the Borough and Our Fire Companies

## Safety First... Now and Always! Enjoy the Holidays!

Home fires occur more during the upcoming holidays and through the winter heating season than any other time of the year.

Minersville Borough and its brave volunteer firefighters send the following tips and reminders to keep you, your family, and our businesses safe.

- Nearly half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February.
- Nearly one-in-eight (12%) home fires and nearly one-in-five (18%) home fire deaths involve heating equipment.
- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet from any heat source (i.e. fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators, or space heaters).
- Keep portable generators outside, away from windows, and as far away from your home as possible.
- Install and test carbon monoxide alarms at least once each month.
- Plug only one heat-producing appliance (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.



- Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents every year.
- Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container and keep it outside at least 10 feet from your home and any nearby buildings.

### Unique fire hazards during the holidays

It's fun to decorate for the winter holidays, but holiday decorations can increase your risk of a home fire. As you deck the halls during this festive time, be fire smart and aware of the possible dangers. Likewise, now with the chill of fall temperatures and the coming of freezing winter conditions, be fire cautious and alert as you stay cozy and warm.



- Almost half of home decoration fires in December are started by candles. Keep candles at least 12 inches away from anything that burns.
- Christmas is the peak day for candle fires. Think about using battery-operated, flameless candles.
- Make sure your tree is at least three feet away from heat sources (i.e. fireplaces, radiators, space heaters, candles, or heat vents). Also make sure your tree does not block exits.
- A dry Christmas tree can burn very hot and very fast. More than one-in-five Christmas tree fires were caused by a heat source too close to the tree.
- Read manufacturer's instructions for the number of light strands to connect.
- Get rid of your tree after Christmas or when it becomes dry.

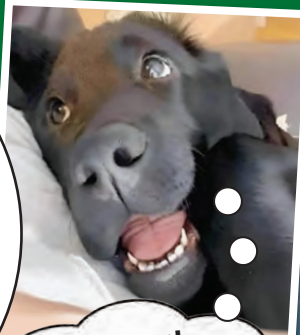

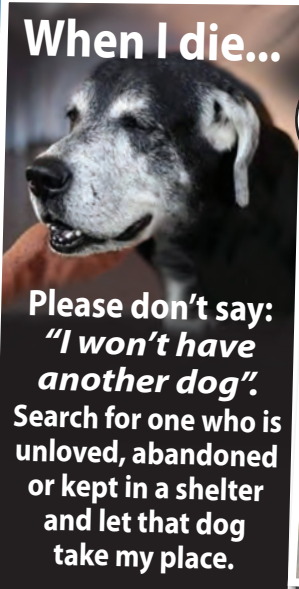

# Minersville Borough Services Update

## Bye-bye street sweeper

The Borough's street sweeper schedule has now ended for 2025 and the sweeper parked for the winter months. But, beware! The sweeper will be called upon again next year from April through the first week in November. The Borough and Police ask your assistance to move all vehicles from the affected streets during the scheduled times so that the sweeper can do its job.

On the first Monday of the month - April through November - between 7:30 and 9 a.m., the sweeper will clean the EVEN-numbered side of Sunbury Street and the ODD sides of both North Street and Front Street.

On the last Thursday of the month - April through October - between 7:30 and 9 a.m., the sweeper will clean the ODD-numbered side of Sunbury Street and the EVEN sides of both North Street and Front Street.

## Curbside recycling collection

As part of the Borough's continuing Recycling Program, the following curbside items will be collected:

#1 thru #7 Plastics, Aluminum and Tin Cans, Green-Brown-and-Clear Glass containers, Newspapers and Magazines (bundled separately)

All recyclable materials must be placed CURBSIDE for pick-up. Please bundle newspapers or magazines with string or place in a brown paper bag or card-

board box separated from your plastic, glass and aluminum for pick-up. Cardboard should be flattened and bundled.

Any loose paper and cardboard not bundled will not be collected. Do not place these recyclables in plastic bags.

Minersville's Pick-up Schedule divides the Borough into two collection areas with Sunbury Street as the dividing line. Properties on the North Side of Sunbury St. and further north will have their recyclables collected on the first and third Wednesdays each month.

Properties on the South side of Sunbury Street and further south will have recyclables collected on the second and fourth Wednesdays. No collection will take place when there is a fifth Wednesday - December 2025 and April, July, and September of 2026.

One exception to the Wednesday collection day occurs in November of 2026. South side collection will be delayed one day to Thursday, Nov. 12 due to the Veterans Day holiday that falls on Wednesday.

Recycling materials, when mixed with garbage, will not be collected. The Borough no longer allows recycling to be dropped off at the N. Delaware Ave. complex. This area is for compost drop-off only.

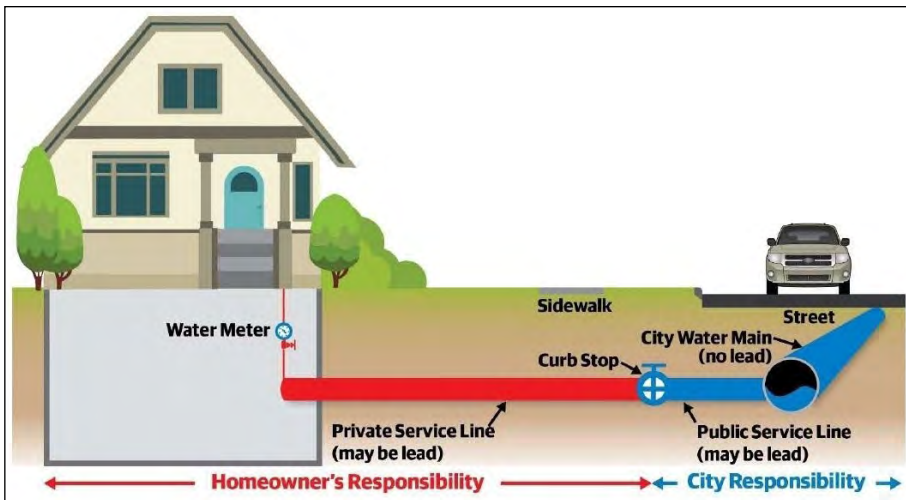
# Lead Line Notification Requirement

## Does Your Water Service Line Contain Lead?

Water system piping that may consist of lead, galvanized requiring replacement, or “lead-status unknown” service lines must inform those served at the service connection.

### What is a Service Line?

A service line is the piping that connects your household or building plumbing to the water main in the street. Ownership varies by water system, but is typically split between the water system and the customer. Minersville Water Authority owns the section of the service line from the water main to the curb stop. The section from the curb stop to the water meter is owned by the customer.



### How can I determine my line material?

The Minersville Borough Municipal Authority is continuing service line identification and replacement. If your service line is found to contain lead or galvanized piping requiring replacement, you will receive a separate notice with information about service line replacement and financing opportunities.

If you know your service line is not lead, please call the office to let us know. If you are unsure, please contact us to set up an appointment for verification.

Exposure to lead in drinking water can cause serious health effects in all age groups. Infants and children can have decreases in IQ and attention span. Lead exposure can lead to new learning and behavior problems or exacerbate existing learning and behavior problems. The children of women who are exposed to lead before or during pregnancy can have increased risk of these adverse health effects. Adults can have increased risks of heart disease, high blood pressure, kidney or nervous system problems.

### How can I reduce exposure to lead?

- Run your water to flush out lead. If the water hasn't been used for several hours, run the water for 15-30 seconds to flush lead from interior plumbing or run the water until it becomes cold or reaches a steady temperature before using it for drinking or cooking. Only use cold water for drinking and cooking.
- Do NOT use water from the hot water tap to make baby formula.
- Do NOT boil water to remove lead. Boiling water will not reduce lead.
- Look for alternative sources or treatment of water, such as use of a pitcher filter that is certified to remove lead and replace the cartridges on a routine frequency, or use bottled water.
- Identify and replace premises plumbing fixtures containing lead. Brass faucets, fittings, and valves, including those advertised as “lead free” installed prior to 2014, may contribute lead to drinking water. The law prior to that time allowed fixtures with up to 8% lead to be labeled as lead-free.
- Regularly clean your aerators/screens on plumbing fixtures. Sediment, debris, and lead particles can collect in your aerator. If lead particles are caught in the aerator, lead can get into your water.
