FINANCIAL REPORT

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Cuff reported the Pine Street Project is due to start the week of July 4.

The ongoing project on Gallow Row should be completed by the end of this week with restoration next week.

The Sunbury Street Project is complete with punch list items next week.

SEWER OPERATOR'S REPORT

Mr. Sukeena presented members with a written report. Mr. Sukeena reported that Blooming Glen found damage to the diffusers and will be to the plant tomorrow. Kline will be doing clean out this and next week. Mr. Sukeena is looking into the UV Project and if any money remains, doing small projects. Mr. Sukeena reported there were two large sinkholes on the bottom of Spring Street, which have been taken care of. Pipe has been ordered for Water Street. Mr. Sukeena has prepared a "wish list" for the plant, as lead-time for some electronic parts is a year.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

After considering the possibility of using money from the CARES Act for a roof on the backside of the plant, it was discovered that the structure needs to be taken down, as it is termite infested. Mr. Cuff will get an estimate from Pioneer Pole for a replacement structure for the June meeting. Mr. Sukeena reported that a salesman is coming this week with pricing for a camera. Mr. Enders suggested checking the head on the current camera before purchasing a new one.
